Project Background	The event-related potential (ERP) technique is widely used to measure the time course of brain activity across a range of basic science (e.g., perception, action, attention, emotion, and language) and clinical science (e.g., schizophrenia, Parkinson's disease, depression) domains. The aim of this Special Topics in Psychology course is to introduce students to the essential aspects of the ERP technique, providing them with a solid foundation for conducting ERP research on normal and abnormal functioning of the mind and brain.
